

- **1.** Saul leaves Jerusalem **1** for Damascus **2**, "breathing threats and murder" against Christians (9:1, 2; 22:4, 5; 26:10–12).
- **2.** Having seen Jesus on the road to Damascus **2**, Saul enters the city and is told by Ananias to be baptized (9:18; 22:16). Immediately he begins preaching (9:20–22).
- 3. Saul retreats to Arabia **3** (Gal. 1:17) and later returns to Damascus. **2** To escape the wrath of the Jews, he leaves the city by night, in a basket (Acts 9:23–25); then he goes to Jerusalem **1**. There he is accepted by Barnabas, and he meets Peter and James (Acts 9:26–28; Gal. 1:18, 19).
- **4.** Again threatened by the Jews, Saul/Paul is taken to Caesarea **9** by the brethren and is sent home to Tarsus **6** (9:29, 30).
- 5. While at home for about seven years, Paul preaches in Cilicia and Syria (Gal. 1:21). Barnabas brought Saul from Tarsus **5** to Antioch **6** where he and Saul worked for a year (Acts 11:22–26).
