Paul's Imprisonment at Caesarea (Part 3)

PAUL, IN HIS TRIAL BEFORE FESTUS, APPEALS TO CAESAR (25:1–12)

As we read chapter 25, we find many details that parallel the previous chapters: Paul on trial, a weak governor, a vindictive Council, a diabolical plot.

- 1. What is known about Festus' background and rule?
- 2. Why did Festus go up to Jerusalem only three days after arriving in the country?
- 3. What does the word translated "concession" in 25:3 tell us about the arrangement intended by the Jews?
- 4. What was the tribunal, and where was it likely located?
- 5. How did the behavior of Paul's accusers at this trial differ from the proper procedure they should have followed?
- 6. What does Paul's defense tell us that the Jews had accused him of?
- 7. What do the various words for the Roman emperor used in this chapter mean?
- 8. How was Festus caught between a rock and a hard place after Paul made his defense?
- 9. In what ways was Festus' suggestion in 25:9 illegal, illogical, and illadvised?
- 10. What answer did Festus expect to his question in 25:9?

- 11. Under what circumstances did a Roman citizen have the right to appeal to Caesar?
- 12. What does history tell us about the Caesar to whom Paul had appealed?
- 13. Why did Paul appeal to Caesar, and why did he wait till this trial to do so?
- 14. How can we know that Paul did not make a mistake in appealing to Caesar?

TWO VISITORS COME TO CAESAREA (25:13–27)

While arrangements were being made for Paul's trial, Festus had two royal visitors: "King Agrippa and Bernice arrived at Caesarea and paid their respects to Festus."

- 15. Who were Agrippa and Bernice, and what does history tell us about them?
- 16. Why did Festus receive his guests so warmly?
- 17. What meanings can the word translated "religion" in 25:19 have, and why is this probably the best translation of it?
- 18. What items on Festus' agenda could he accomplish by granting his guests' request to hear Paul preach?
- 19. What was the nature of the "great pomp" (25:23) with which Agrippa and Bernice came to hear Paul?
- 20. What ironic statements did Festus make in 25:25, 27?
