## SATAN IS BOUND (20:1–3)

It is difficult for words to convey the importance and excitement of chapter 20. The difficulty is not that the passage mentions a thousand years, but that it announces the demise of Satan.

- 3. Is the "thousand years" mentioned in verse 2 literal? Explain.
- 4. If the number is symbolic, what does it symbolize?
- 5. What does the binding in verse 2 symbolize?
- 6. In what ways has the Lord limited Satan's power?
- 7. What is meant by "for a short time" (20:3), and what are the problems with common interpretations of the phrase?

## THE FIRST RESURRECTION (20:4–6)

Verses 4 through 6 of chapter 20 of Revelation make up the most controversial section of the most controversial chapter of the most controversial book in the Bible.

- 8. What three categories do millennial writers use to classify people?
- 9. What is "dispensational premillennialism," and what are its weaknesses?
- 10. What Scriptures reveal that Christ already reigns over His kingdom?

- 11. What is the doctrine of multiple bodily resurrections, and what Scriptures disprove it?
- 12. What is the Old Testament background for Revelation 20:4–6?
- 13. Why were the souls in verse 4 pictures as having been beheaded?
- 14. How does the meaning of the phrase "judgment was given to them" in 20:4 compare with other Scriptures depicting Christians sitting in judgment over evil men?
- 15. What does the word translated "came to life" (20:4) mean, and what are the implications of this meaning?
- 16. If all Christians have been raised up and reign with Jesus, what was the purpose of repeating the promise regarding those who had been martyred?
- 17. What does the word "this" refer to in verse 5?
- 18. What was "the first resurrection" (20:5)?
- 19. What does the phrase "the rest of the dead" (verse 5) mean?
- 20. What is "the second death" (20:6)?
